Interrelationship of Buildings and Surroundings

The house is so close to the road and is part of an architecturally significant cluster of dwellings in Georgetown Center.

Other Notable Features or Buildings on the Site

The modestly proportioned and details, two-story, three-bay by three-bay, vernacular dwelling was constructed as worker housing for the nearby wire mill. The overhanging eves are boxed and six-over-six windows are used throughout. The house is been extended on the rear by a lean-to addition.

Historical and Architectural Importance



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23 Church Street, Wilton

Despite its retarditaire styling the house is constructed circa 1915 by Georgetown landowner Louis Miller. It was used as a rental home for workers of the Gilbert and Bennett company. Miller was the son of Maj. David Henry Miller, secretary and later president of Gilbert and Bennett, and himself was a superintendent at the mill. After his death in 1949, his considerable holdings past to his widow Olive, or Carrie, and she was also known. She sold many of the houses to the occupants. In 1961, this house was purchased by Robert Stromberg (89:353).
