Interrelationship of Buildings and Surroundings

Located immediately south of the church on a residential street in Georgetown Center.

Other Notable Features or Buildings on the Site

The simple, three-bay, two-story, central hall plan dwelling built circa 1875 has boxed, overhanging eaves and six-over-six windows. The façade is sheltered by a shed roof veranda with chamfered, Italianate posts with molded caps, and the entrance door has glazed, circular-headed upper panels. A lean-to addition extends the rear elevation. Asbestos shingles hide the original sheathing, but otherwise the house appears to be well preserved.

Historical and Architectural Importance

The Georgetown Methodist Protestant Church was established in 1839, but the parsonage, located south of the church, was not constructed until after 1872 on land sold to the church by Betsy Hubbell. Todd's 1888 history of Redding states that the Methodists purchased Mr. Weed's house

for the Parsonage in 1955, but no record of the transaction was found in the Wilton land records. The earlier parsonage may well have been located in the Redding portion of the town. This parsonage is not depicted on the 1867 Beers map of Georgetown. Architecturally the house is typically of the ca. 1875 ear. The Georgetown Methodist Church is the only early Methodist church in Wilton to still have its adjacent parsonage.
