Interrelationship of Buildings and Surroundings

Located on a sparsely developed, rural road.

Other Notable Features or Buildings on the Site

The present house incorporates a circa 1870 school house that was moved to the site about 1937. The school house is sheathed with clapboards and has small, six-over-six windows, boxed overhanging eaves, and the original, arched panel belfry and bell. The original doors have been removed. A one and one-half story, shingled wing with twelve-over-twelve windows and a central entrance with full-length side lights was added to the west end of the former school. The rear or west side of the house has been opened up by large windows and a modern deck.

Historical and Architectural Importance

The nucleus of the present house is the former Bald Hill School, one of the 10 district schools operated in Wilton prior to 1929 when the new Center School was opened. Originally located on the northeast corner of Ridgefield and Millstone Roads, it was moved to the present site in 1937 by G. Evans Hubbard. He transferred title to his wife Dorothy in 1945, and she held it until 1965. The Hubbards converted the school house into a dwelling, and they used it as a rental property.
